Such statements did not recur. The history of Jedwabne and other cases of persecution or poor treatment of Jews by Poles still represents an open wound in the Polish consciousness. My 18 year old brother, Solon, a freshman at the University of Texas, decided to enlist, and entreated my parents to sign permission for him to do so, which they ultimately did. The average Pole knows that five to six million Polish citizens died during the war. The last trainload that got in through there, [the Germans] knew they couldn't process so they machine-gunned everybody right in the train cars that they were in. You're just there doing what you're told to. They were primarily some F4Fs, some SBDs, scout bombers, some torpedo bombers, and that type of thing.

Previous engagements were already cited with the Presidential Citation, but then at school I had several friends who knew of families who were housing one or more refugees from abroad. It seemed to look like this for a long time before it was rebuilt and even now when I visit London you get the feeling that every demolished building is a bomb site.
